As the manager of the Early Start to Emancipation Preparation Tutoring Program, I have the opportunity to interface with many community leaders in the field of tutoring and mentoring youth. The ESTEP Tutoring program provides in-home skills-based therapeutic tutoring to over 500 youth in the foster care system each year; the model established has received national attention as the ESTEP Tutoring has been identified as an innovative program deserving of longitudinal evaluation through the Chafe Act. We are excitedly awaiting the initial outcome findings of this longitudinal study.
